

Week 3: January 27-February 2

Introduce Guests/Share Life: How has this week been going? Good? Bad? Ugly? Things to celebrate? **Open in Prayer:** *Include any prayer needs that came up while you were sharing life together.* **Recall the Guidelines:** Ask: "What is the purpose of the quidelines?" Answer: To be relational!

Share the Vision: This small group is a discipleship group. Our primary goal is to equip you to be a disciple who makes disciples of Jesus. Everything we do in this group is reproducible so you can do it with others.

Ask someone to tell last week's story (Proverbs 6:1-11 – Illustrations of the ant, etc.).

Hook Question: What do you, or others, consider you to be good at?

Ask someone from your team to read or tell the following background for the story:

Today's story is from the life of Jesus. Jesus was nearing the end of his earthly ministry. He was sitting on a mountain ridge called Olivet, telling his disciples about how he would leave and return. His disciples were curiously asking him questions. They were wondering about the end of time, and when Jesus would return. After telling his disciples that no one knows when he will return and to be ready, he tells tonight's story.

A note about currency: in Jesus' time, there were different forms of currency. Today's story denotes one of them: a talent. Simply, a talent would equate about 20 years' worth of labor. Quick maths tell us that \$25k x 20 = \$500k. Simply put, this is intended to represent a large sum of money.

With an understanding of the background, this is where our story begins...

Tell the story from Matthew 25:14-30: Use different storytellers. Teach your group to share God's Word. **Rebuild the story:** *Group members retell the story based on what they remember.* **Read the story from Matthew 25:14-30:** *Ask the group to read these verses.*

Discussion Questions: learn to talk about God's Word with others...

Head Questions: Quicker tempo

> Slow down & wait!

- What do you find interesting about this story?
- What makes someone a good manager?
- What does this story teach us about people?
- What does this story teach us about God?
- **Heart & Hand** Jesus says the master entrusts according to ability. What are some things God has entrusted to you? Questions:

 - What do you think God is trying to show you right now? How do you need to change?
 - Who could retell the story for us right here one last time?

Thank your storyteller for sharing the Word. Ask for a volunteer storyteller for next week. Close in prayer.
