



God is Omnipresent.

Another one of the wonders of God described in scripture is that He is omnipresent. The word Omni means all. Present means here.

Omnipresent means God is always all here!

Being Omnipresent describes both God's location and His concentration.

1. God's location

David said that wherever he traveled, God was always all there.

Ps 139:7-10

7 Where can I go from Your Spirit? Or where can I flee from Your presence?

8 If I ascend into heaven, You are there; If I make my bed in hell, behold, You are there.

9 If I take the wings of the morning, and dwell in the uttermost parts of the sea,

10 Even there Your hand shall lead me, and Your right hand shall hold me.

NKJV

David said that wherever he traveled, God is always all here. Omnipresent refers to God's location.

But omnipresent also refers to God's concentration.

2. God's concentration

David also said wherever He traveled, He had God's full attention.

Ps 139:1-6

0 Lord, You have searched me and known me.

2 You know my sitting down and my rising up; You understand my thought afar off.

3 You comprehend my path and my lying down, and are acquainted with all my ways.

4 For there is not a word on my tongue, but behold, O Lord, You know it altogether.

5 You have hedged me behind and before, and laid Your hand upon me.

6 Such knowledge is too wonderful for me; It is high, I cannot attain it.

David knew there was never one moment in time that he did not have God's undivided attention.

David understood that God has the divine ability to give every individual His undivided attention as if they are the only other person that exists. He is omnipresent! God is always all here. Omnipresent refers to God's concentration.



When I am in a room crowded with people, I am present physically in the room with everyone, but mentally, I can only give my undivided attention to one person at a time. I am limited. God is not.

God can be with every person and give every person in the room His undivided attention at the same time. He is omnipresent! God is always all here.

God's ability to be all here is perpetual. It is never ending.
This means....

- He never takes His eyes off you
- He never forgets you
- He never gets distracted
- He never leaves you to work on something else
- He never takes a break
- He never forsakes you when you offend Him
- He never allows anything to get between you and Him
- He never sleeps
- He never dies

He is always all here!

You may think that God was like this for David because he favored David and He does not favor you.

David was favored by God and chosen to be King of Israel. But what David expressed about God was not true because David was favored. It is true because God is omnipresent. Who God was to David, God is to everyone. Omnipresent is who God is. God is always all here!

Right now, God is concentrating on you as if you are the only person on the planet. You have always had His full attention, you have His full attention, and you will always have His full attention.

It is like God is the ultimate stalker who is engrossed with you. He sees your every thought, every feeling, every word, every action, and ever motive. He is always staring at you even when you are not thinking about Him.

How does this truth about God make you feel about God?

David loved this truth when He was being obedient to God. He said such knowledge is too wonderful for me. I cannot comprehend it.

I don't think David loved this truth about God when he was sleeping with another man's wife and when he had this man murdered. (2 Samuel 12).

How could David commit these sins and know God was omnipresent?

1. Perhaps David did not know God was omnipresent when he committed these sins? Perhaps it was when the prophet Nathan confronted David about his sins that David realized God was omnipresent.
2. Perhaps David knew God was omnipresent, but he was so overcome with lust he did not care.
3. Perhaps David knew God was omnipresent, but He did not believe God is just.

Deuteronomy 32:3-4

3 For I proclaim the name of the Lord: Ascribe greatness to our God.

4 He is the Rock, His work is perfect; For all His ways are justice, A God of truth and without injustice; Righteous and upright is He.

The bible says that God is keeping an account of our sins.

God is just means that for every law we break, God requires an equal punishment. For God to be just means for every sin I commit, God adds the penalty I deserve to the other side of the scale.

Will you experience the penalties you deserve for your sins in this life?



There are times during our life that we suffer the consequences of our sins. But there are many times when we don't. Many books have been written about people that did terrible things in this life and those things were not discovered until after they died. We all know that there will always be injustice in this world. Right? There could be a book written about each one of us regarding the injustices we have suffered, and the injustices others have suffered because of us.

If God is just, when is His justice going to be satisfied?

It will happen in eternity. The bible says we will all stand before a holy and righteous God and He will judge every one of us according to our deeds. (Revelation 20:11-15)

If God is just, I do not like the truth that God is omnipresent and keeping an accurate account of my sins.

Unless of course there is a way for God's justice to be satisfied in some way that does cause me to suffer what I deserve.

The bible says God is love. God is love means God is benevolent. He does not delight in the death of the wicked.

[Ezekiel 33:11](#)

[11 Say to them: 'As I live,' says the Lord God, 'I have no pleasure in the death of the wicked....](#)

So, if God is love, what could God do to satisfy His justice for our sins in eternity?



God gave His Son Jesus as payment for sin, once and for all. His suffering and death satisfied God's judgment against us once and for all, for all of eternity. It is finished!

God's just nature is fully satisfied, if we have received Jesus and we are following Him.

Will you receive Jesus and follow Him? The first way that you follow Him is by following Him in baptism. Will you receive Jesus and be baptized?

For anyone who has received Jesus, it would seem that it would give them a freedom to sin without fear of God's justice. Receiving Jesus does give you a freedom from the fear of eternal punishment for sin.

So, why don't we continue in sin?

When you receive Jesus, God gives you His Spirit. His Spirit changes your heart. Because His Spirit is the Spirit of love, you avoid sin because you love God and love others. It is because we are immature in love that we keep sinning against God and others. Spiritual growth is about growing in love for God and for others. We grow spiritually by being in relationship with God and with His church.

Will you receive Jesus and grow spiritually by being in relationship with God and with His church?
